- Provided for Youth Service
- Match club contribution one for one up to \$1,000 per club/project
- Deadline: November 1st
- Up to \$5,000 total provided annually
- One page application
- Requires budget and ending report

5300 District Simplified Grants

Application and guidelines found at District website under 'Grants', just below Rotary International Foundation about half way down left side. (Do not confuse application for 5300 District Simplified Grants with the application the district must file (DSG) that is under RI Foundation)

- Preferably domestic projects within any avenue of service
- Deadline July 31
- Total available dependent upon District Designated Funds received from Foundation giving 3 years prior and TRF approval*
- Amount requested for 05-06 \$25,000
- Three page application
- Requires budget, interim and final report
- Replace dollars at 100% for use in project when 'new' monies are donated to Rotary Foundation Annual Fund since District receives 50% of such monies back in 3 years as DDF
- Club members donating new monies to The Rotary Foundation receive Paul Harris credit
- 50% match for club cash used in project
- No match for existing club funds at TRF

- Project must be NEW and completed by June 30 or the money returned to District 5300
- MUST have Rotarian "hands-on"

Application and guidelines found at District Website under 'Rotary Links', 'Rotary International', 'The Rotary Foundation' (found on task bar), 'Humanitarian Grants Program', 'Matching Grants', **see how to apply**, 'Minor', 'Major'

- Provides for international (also Native American) service projects involving two or more clubs, districts and countries
- TRF match 1:1 ddf (District Designated Funds) and 50% of club cash
- District match of club cash 1:1 using ddf
- Minor Grant - Under \$2,000
- Major Grant - \$2,001 - \$150,000
- Apps accepted 1 July – 31 March
- Rolling approval 1 August – 1 May
- Grant requests over \$25,000 Aug. 1st for Oct. vote and Jan. 1st for April vote
- Minor Application - four pages
- Major Application – five pages
- Requires budget, interim & final report

3-H Grants - multi year \$300,000+ with max. of \$35,000 from the clubs

1st step submit proposal to TRF

Club must previously have done a successful MG MUST have Rotarian involvement

Blane Immunization Grants (\$500ddf)

- One grant per club - use locally
- \$500 from club + \$500 ddf + \$1,000 TRF

Individual Grants (from World Fund)

- International travel to plan a project OR
- Provide direct service to a project
- Up to \$5,000 per person (based # of days)
- Max. \$6,000 per group of 2-5 people
- Max. 2 IGs per individual per Rotary year
