

Panelists - Introductions:

Mary Lou Elliott, was a principal at Andres Duarte elementary school in 1977 when she joined the Duarte Rotary as the first woman Rotary member in the world.

Luke McJimpson was principal of Duarte High School, and one of the eight male Rotary members that voted to accept the first women into the club.

Ken Caresio is the former city manager of Duarte who was a member of the Duarte Rotary during the entire course of the court case.

Sanford K. Smith, who was an attorney for the Duarte Unified School District at the time, provided his services to the Duarte Rotary pro bono throughout the nine year case.

Carol Agate, currently an Administrative Law Judge, was the ACLU attorney for the three women members in the law suit against Rotary International and was the attorney of record in the Supreme Court case.

Dr. Sylvia Whitlock, school principal at Maxwell School in Duarte, joined the Ex-Rotary of Duarte but was elected the first female president of Rotary in the world of the reinstated Rotary Club of Duarte.

Shelan Joseph, a Los Angeles County public defender and an American Civil Liberties Union affirmative action attorney serves on the ACLU Southern California and ACLU national boards of directors.

Christine Montan is District Governor for Rotary International District 5300. She was the first woman member of the Alhambra Rotary in 1987 and is a fourth-generation Rotarian.
