

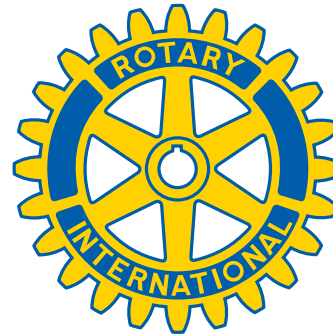

What is RYLA?

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is an intensive training program for High School Juniors. Talented young people attend a 3 day seminar organized by the Rotarians of District 5300 of Rotary International.

All of the participants' expenses are often paid by sponsoring Rotary clubs.

The RYLA program enables young people to debate issues of professional responsibility and human relations, improve leadership and communications skills, learn about businesses and institutions, and meet Rotarians while having fun and making friends.

For young adults, RYLA provides the opportunity to refine skills and explore pertinent topics with their peers and business professionals.

What does RYLA offer?

During a RYLA program, you will:

- Gain exposure to issues and exchange ideas with talented people like you
- Learn how to coordinate youth activities and community service projects in your community
- Discover creative approaches for resolving family, social and professional conflicts
- Meet Rotary decision-makers in your community and learn about other Rotary programs for young people
- Have a valuable leadership experience that will enhance college applications



Who participates in RYLA?

RYLA events are for young adults with proven leadership experience and potential leaders from diverse backgrounds. If you are a High School Junior you will learn, grow, have fun and make friends.

The RYLA experience prepares young people to be leaders in their community, profession, and other facets of everyday life.

Participants in RYLA 2012 must not be 18 years of age prior to March 4, 2012.
